In it for the Long Haul

Jackson. A non-profit, Victory Village, runs a program that is of, by and for Veterans. This organization runs a regional program that is for several Mother Lode counties including El Dorado. My visit there resulted in nothing but positives. Yes, we will house your meth users. Yes, we will help your sex offender get into an apartment. Yes, we will help your bad conduct discharge Veteran. Yes, we will help your alcoholic, homeless Veteran who will not leave his girl friend, because whoever he says is his family, IS his family.

Fresno. The state Veterans home in Fresno is a beautiful facility just built in 2013. The good news is that it was easy to make an appointment for an interview for a homeless veteran. Further good news is that once the RCFE (Residential Care Facility for the Elderly) opens, he probably will be admitted. The bad news is that a 30 bed memory unit as well as a 30 bed RCFE unit are ready for occupancy EXCEPT for the fact that something like two dozen more CNAs need to be hired. The state Veterans homes have been hobbled by an administrative rule requiring that the CNA have six months experience elsewhere before they can be hired at Fresno (or Redding). Getting rid of this rule is necessary to open these beds up, and get people off the streets.

Yountville. This beautiful state Veterans home has its arms wide open for homeless veterans. Females can actually get their own room. That is a given in Redding or Fresno, but a miracle in Yountville. Usually, two Veterans are sharing a room that looks to be 80 or 100 square feet, with a curtain down the center to give a person a sense of privacy. August 13, I will take a homeless Veteran for admission, where he will continue his recent journey in recovery from a half century of heroin use.

Redding. Another newly constructed state Veterans home (2013). August 11, I will be taking a homeless Veteran there for admission. Yountville will take addicts who have 90 days of sobriety. Yountville will take Veterans with mental health issues, who can successfully live in community. Redding is looking for the homeless Veteran without addiction or mental health issues. Miraculously, I found one, and Redding was so excited that they sent the conditional (it is always conditional) acceptance letter within 24 hours of his interview. Like Fresno, Redding has a 30 bed Skilled Nursing wing waiting for CNA staffing. Once that wing opens, it will be easier to place more high functioning homeless Veterans in the RCFE side.
